4 Reason and Judicial Basis for Handling Personal Data	<p>The purpose of the data is to act as a distribution list for Defence Forces press releases and firing and noise notices.</p> <p>By registering as a user of the service you are giving your consent, per EU GDPR art 6 item 1a, for processing your personal data for the purpose mentioned above.</p>
5 Personal Data Categories (what personal data is in the file)	Email

<p>6 Personal Data Origin and Regular Sources of Data</p>	<p>The subscriber of the service provides the necessary data when registering as a user.</p>
<p>7 Personal Data Recipients or Categories of Recipient</p>	<p>The personal data is managed by the personnel representatives of the Finnish Defence Forces Public Information Branch.</p>
<p>8 Data Transfer to a Third Country or to an International Organisation (European Commission adequacy decision or knowledge of documents about adequate safeguards if transfer is based on article 46 or article 49 sub-paragraph 1b)</p>	<p>No information disclosure and transfer of data outside EU or European Economic Area. Data files not be shared with a third party.</p>
<p>9 Data Storage Period/ Criteria for Determining Period</p>	<p>The personal data in the subscriber service for press releases will be stored until the subscriber notifies they wish to end using the service or until the life cycle of the service ends.</p>
<p>10 Possible Use of Profiling (Meaningful Information on the Handling Logic, Significance and the Envisaged Consequences for the Data Subject)</p>	<p>The Finnish Defence Forces will not use the information for automated decision-making or profiling. All users of the service have access to the same content.</p>

<p>11 Principles for securing data file</p>	<p>Data files will not be shared with a third party.</p> <p>The data files are protected in the same way as with the entire central government ICT platform (Valtori manages and is responsible for the functionality and legality of the product).</p>
<p>12 Right to Request Access to and Rectification or Erasure of Personal Data or Restriction of Processing</p>	<p>The data consists of information supplied by the data subject.</p> <p>If the data subject wishes to have their information deleted, they can do so by cancelling their order or by contacting the Finnish Defence Forces feedback email puolustusvoimat@mil.fi.</p> <p>The subscription can be reactivated after cancelling or removal of the data, if the subscriber so wishes.</p>
<p>13 Right to Object to Processing as well as the Right to Data Portability</p>	<p>The subscriber has the right to object to the data handling if they feel that their information has processed in an illegal way. Only the data provided by the subscriber is in the file.</p> <p>The subscriber may request to view the personal data stored by contacting the Finnish Defence Forces feedback email puolustusvoimat@mil.fi.</p>
<p>14 Right to Withdraw Consent at Any Time (if Handling is Based on Consent)</p>	<p>The data subject has the right to withdraw his or her consent at any time.</p>
<p>15 Right to Take the Matter to the Data Protection Ombudsman</p>	<p>According to article 77 of the GDPR every data subject shall have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority, in particular in the Member State of his or her habitual residence, place of work or place of the alleged infringement.</p> <p>The data subject may lodge a complaint with the Data Protection Ombudsman, if they consider that we infringe the current data protection legislation.</p>
